1. Ontolloct [the capacity for knowledge]

- (1) Thinks Matthew 9:4
- (2) Reasons Mark 2:8
- (3) Understands Matthew 13:15
- (4) Believes Romans 10:10

2. Emotion

[the affective aspect of consciousness: feeling]

- (1) Despises 2 Samuel 6:16
- (2) Desires Romans 10:1
- (3) Loves Matthew 22:37
- (4) Trusts Proverbs 3:5

How can D change my intellect?

My intellect is changed according to the presented evidence.

- Thomas John 20:24-29, 31
- Romans 10:17

The Bible heart includes the whole of man's inner being. ◀

Matt. 5:8: 6:21 2 Cor. 4:16 Acts 2:37

How can D change my emotions?

The believed testimony produces the change in emotions.

- Faith in the testimony of Christ changes our desires, loves, and trusts.
 - There can be no change of heart until all four of these (intellect, emotion, will, conscience) are changed.

3. Will / Volition choosing in a determining

[the power of determining)

- (1) Determines 1 Cor. 7:37
- (2) Intends Hebrews 4:12
- (3) Purposes Acts 11:23
- (4) Obeys Romans 6:17

Example: Saul (Acts 22:16):

Saul determined, intended, and purposed not to obey Christ, thinking Jesus was an impostor.

The audible word of Christ changed his beliefs

How can D change my will?

My will is changed by motives produced by faith.

Motive: believe in the goodness of Christ (Rom. 2:4)

Motive: believe in the reward of the obedient (Heb. 5:9)

Motive: believe in punishment for disobedient (Rev. 20:15)

Romans 6:17-18 – We must believe from an obedient heart.

4. Conscience

[the sense or consciousness of the moral goodness or blameworthiness of one's own conduct, intentions, or character together with a feeling of obligation to do right or be good]

(1) Condemns or Condemns Not

1 John 3:20-21

One who understands and believes what Christ has commanded will never have an approving conscience until he or she obeys.

How can D change my conscience?

Faith in having done right, having obeyed the commands of God, changes the condemning conscience.

Example: Saul's conscience (Acts 23:1)
